- Some of the things we will be doing and learning about this term are:
- Designing eye-catching leaflets and adverts to persuade people to visit Llanelli.
- Discussing public graffiti and sharing opinions on whether it is art or vandalism.
- Expressing likes and dislikes in Welsh and learning Welsh vocabulary for clothing.
- Creating a timeline of Llanelli, including important events and well-known buildings.
- Investigating why pollution levels are higher in large cities and exploring ways we can help reduce it.
- Finding out why cats' eyes appear to glow in the dark.
- Exploring street dance and developing new dance skills.
- Building a 3D model village of Bynea/Llanelli using recycled materials.
- Using imagination and creativity to design what Llanelli might look like in 50 years' time.
- Learning about Banksy and local graffiti artist, Steve Jenks, to recreate artwork inspired by their styles.
- Celebrating the 50th anniversary of Ysgol Y Bynea.

Some useful information:

- Reading books need to be brought into school every Monday and Friday. Please listen to your child read and talk about what happens in the story. Please complete and sign their reading record.
- Homework will be a grid of learning activities, which will be given out every half term. One activity will need to be completed each week and returned in their homework book or uploaded to HWB every Monday.
- Spellings will be given on a Monday and will need to be learnt for a spelling test the following Thursday.
- For PE lessons, children will need suitable footwear, a white t-shirt and either black shorts, joggers or leggings. Please label all clothing items and place them in a bag, which also has their name on. PE kits will be kept in school and returned home every half-term for washing. Wellies can be brought into school and left there (clearly labelled with your child's name) as we will be making good use of our outside areas.
- All children need to bring a water bottle to school every day. Plain water only, in line with Welsh Assembly guidelines.
- Children are encouraged to bring in one piece of fruit that they can eat during break time. Fruit is also available to buy for 30p in the school tuck shop.
- All stationery is provided in school, so the children do not need a pencil case, etc.
- Please label all your child's belongings – including uniform, bags, fruit pots, water bottles, etc.
- Remember to use Reading Eggs and HWB at home, to improve language, numeracy and ICT skills.
